

Website Assignment Rubric

- I. Content (worth 50 points)
 - a. Author addressed all **major**/relevant points in the assignment. (25)
 - i. However, if a point is **not relevant** to your language, you should not address it in your website. This is a rare situation.
 - ii. Assignments have Parts, Points and Subpoints. You must do all Parts, and address all Points. The Subpoints are to help you and give you guidance in addressing the Points.
 1. In this rubric, the Parts are labeled I, II, III; The points are labeled a,b,c... Subpoints are labeled i, ii, iii...
 - b. The writing shows understanding of all terms used. (15 pts.)
 - i. If quotes are used, they are folded into the discussion of the topic. Copy & Paste without discussion or explanation will not receive full credit.
 - c. Author adapted general ideas to be language-specific. (10 pts.)
- II. Research (worth 25 points)
 - a. Author did independent internet research to find information for language. (15 pts) Research includes searching Ethnologue, SIL, CBOLD, Wikipedia, Encyclopedia Britannica, etc.
 - b. Sources have been cited. (10 pts)
- III. Presentation (worth 25 points)
 - a. The page was written with academic audience in mind. (10 pts)
 - i. Language is appropriate for non-specialists.
 - ii. Pages are written in paragraph form, not Q&A just answering the questions.
 - b. Standard Written English (10 pts)
 - i. Author uses complete sentences.
 - ii. Paragraphs structure is used when necessary.
 - iii. Punctuation, capitalization rules are followed.
 - c. Organization (5pts)
 - i. Pages are clearly labeled.
 - ii. Headings follow some logic.
 - iii. Pages are posted and made Public or Password protected.
